Ordinance No. O-90-2(a-1)

An Ordinance of the Township of Milton, County of DuPage, Illinois

INOPERABLE MOTOR VEHICLES

BE IT ORDAINED by the electors of Milton Township, represented in the Town Board of Trustees:

That the Milton Township Ordinance 90-2, INOPERABLE MOTOR VEHICLES, be and hereby is amended to read as follows:

"Milton Township, DuPage County, Illinois  
Ordinance No. O-90-2  
**INOPERABLE MOTOR VEHICLES**"

(a) *Authority.* Pursuant to the provisions of Section 30-130(a) of the Illinois Township Code [60 ILCS 30-130(a)], the Board of Trustees of Milton Township hereby declares inoperable motor vehicles within Milton Township, whether on public or private property, to be a nuisance.

(b) *Written Notice.* When an inoperable motor vehicle, as defined in 60 ILCS 1/30-130(c), is found within the Township, the Township shall cause a written notice to be sent by regular mail to the owner of record of the vehicle or to the person or entity under whose control the vehicle is, at his, her or its last known or ascertainable address, to dispose of the inoperable vehicle.

(c) *Posted Notice.* In addition to the written notice provided in Section (b), the Township may, but is not required to cause a notice to be posted in or on the inoperable vehicle demanding its removal.

(d) *Removal.* If, after seven (7) calendar days from the issuance of the written notice provided in paragraph (b), the vehicle has not been disposed of, then the Sheriff or any law enforcement agency with applicable jurisdiction is hereby authorized to remove and dispose of the inoperable vehicle or parts of such vehicle pursuant to the provisions of the Illinois Vehicle Code (625 ILCS 5/1-100 et seq.).


(e) *Fine.* In the event said vehicle is not removed within the seven (7) calendar days from the date of issuance of the written notice provided in paragraph (b), the owner or person or entity in control of said inoperable vehicle shall be fined by (\$50.00) Dollars per day for each day thereafter until the vehicle is removed. All fines shall be paid to the Milton Township Supervisor for deposit in the Milton Township General Fund.

(f) *Towing, Storage and Incidental Costs.* In the event any law enforcement agency causes said inoperable vehicle to be removed pursuant to the authority granted in paragraph (d), the owner or entity in control of said inoperable vehicle shall pay any and all costs of towing, storage and disposal as well as any incidental costs associated therewith. All such costs shall be paid to the Milton Township Supervisor for deposit in the Milton Township General Fund."

*Effective Date:* This Amendment shall take effect immediately upon its passage by the Town Board and its publication according to law.
